enhanced our worship and been very much appreciated by our congregation.

And the choir that hovered around 4 to 6 singers for several years has grown significantly to 10 to fifteen singers regularly.

These last two accomplishments are a tribute to Stephen and to his giftedness and wonderful way with people. And I would be remiss if I didn't acknowledge the way in which he has become a very real member of our church family participating in the Adult Ed class and other events when he could. Given the distance he must drive to get here, these

were evidence of his commitment not only to the church but to the Lord.

I will miss Stephen's friendship and his musicianship as he now opens a new chapter in his life as he and Sharon and the kids move to their new home in Florida and pray Godspeed for them.
